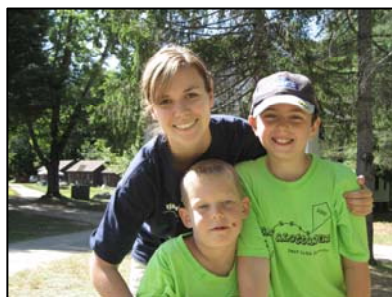


The Joke Box

Program Director: Abbie Parker

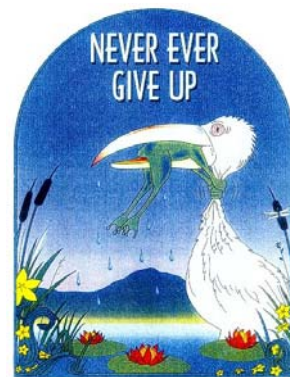
